# The Epsilon Pi Uplift Foundation

### SCHOLARSHIP IMPLEMENTATION GUIDELINES

## **Purpose**

The major purpose of the Epsilon Pi Uplift Foundation scholarship program is as follows:

- A. Address the scholarship needs of the High School seniors
- B. Provide financial incentive
- C. Address the alarming high school/college drop-out rate of males
- D. Improve the number of males who attend and graduate from college
- E. Assist in the preservation of Historically Black Colleges & Universities (HBCU)

### Foundation President

The President appoints a committee to do the following:

- 1. Provide at least two monetary scholarships to a graduating and deserving high school senior, be they Male or Female.
- 2. Make attending an HBCU the highest priority.
- 3. Determine fund raising activities.
  - 1. Special assessment included with dues
  - 2. Dances, Cabarets, raffles
  - 3. Tournaments such as basketball and others
  - 4. Contributions individual and business
- 4. Establish selection and evaluation procedures to be used.
- 5. Publicize the availability of awards using social media channels, radio stations, publications, houses of worship, beauty shops, barber shops, or other outlets deemed useful by the President.
- 6. Publicize all pertinent information relating to Epsilon Pi Uplift Foundation scholarship participation efforts.

### SCOPE

The Epsilon Pi Uplift Foundation will provide scholarships to graduating high school students who live in Delaware County (PA) and surrounding area. Scholarship awards will typically be granted annually in the third week of June. The Scholarships are to provide educational assistance to the children and parents of students who meet the selection criteria 50% of the corporation's time will be spent on this activity. \*

The Epsilon Pi Uplift Foundation will provide mentoring, child development and enrichment services to minor residents of the Delaware County and surrounding area. The Omega Academy is a mentoring program that will be administered by The Epsilon Pi Uplift Foundation for underprivileged males between the ages of 12-15. Regular monthly meetings will focus on math, science and technology, English, self-esteem, and leadership training. Funds will be raised to provide college scholarships to participants in the academy. The program will be coordinated by members of the corporation and will comprise 25% of the corporation's time and resources.

The Epsilon Pi Uplift Foundation will provide leadership and integrity training, career awareness, and self-esteem and manhood development to High School Junior and Senior Males. The Omega League is a mentoring program that will be administered by the Epsilon Pi Uplift Foundation for exemplary males in their Junior and Senior years of High School. Regular monthly meetings will place an emphasis on duty, honor, strong leadership skills and communication skills. Our goal is to help prepare these teenagers to be young men. This will be accomplished through our example. Our activities will include visits to nursing homes, Thanksgiving and Christmas baskets prepared for the homeless; clothing drives; leadership and communication games and field trips to historical and educational sites in the Delaware County and surrounding area. It is also our hope that the Omega League will be the natural follow on for our Omega Academy participants.

### All members of the:

- a. Foundation will participate in the program and will be spear- headed by the Scholarship and Social Action Committee.
- b. This activity will consume 25% of the fund-raising interests, time and resources of the corporation.
- c. Other endeavors will be planned in the future.
- The Epsilon PI Chapter of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. initiated its scholarship program approximately 50 years ago.
- The major activity of The Epsilon Pi Uplift Foundation in relation to each of these programs will be fund-raising.

The Epsilon Pi Uplift Foundation will administer the scholarship awards program in conjunction with the Epsilon Pi Chapter (Epsilon Pi) of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. (the fraternity). It will adopt the same procedures and requirements followed by the fraternity as described herein.

The following awards are given each year:

A minimum of two individual \$1,000 scholarships to a deserving, graduating high school senior in Delaware County, PA.

The scholarships totaling \$2,000 at minimum; are awarded to students chosen from among those who submit a written or electronic application packet in response to the Foundation's announcement of and call for applications for the scholarships. (See attached application).

Scholarship announcements and application forms are sent to public and parochial schools in Delaware County by February of each year. The announcement includes the due date for submission of applications, usually within the first two weeks of May.

Eligibility criteria are as follows:

- i. Students *must* be a resident of Delaware County at the time of application.
- ii. Students *must* have a scholastic average of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale.
- iii. Student <u>must</u> be entering a four-year college or university as a full-time freshman student in the fall of the year of the announcement of the scholarship award.

Application procedures include a review of the student's academic record, SAT or ACT scores, public service and recommendations. A Screening Panel of Foundation members review all applications to determine who meets at least the minimum criteria. Eligible applications are reviewed, rated and ranked by the Panel. The Panel recommends applicants to the Foundation. Upon acceptance by the Foundation, the Panel notifies the scholarship recipients, and a Foundation representative <u>may</u> attend the High School's Class/Awards Day program in June for the announcement of the awards.

Recipients must notify the Foundation of enrollment at a university. Upon such notice, the Foundation will release the funds as follows:

i. The individual scholarships are typically awarded in single payment. The payment will be made after notification of enrollment and requested transmission/payment remittance information is received.

#### 2024 SCHOLARSHIP COMPETITION

### **OBJECTIVE**

The EPSILON PI Uplift Foundation and the EPSILON PI Chapter of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. through its scholarship program, the Epsilon Pi Uplift Foundation Scholarship Contest provides scholarships annually to outstanding graduating high school students in Delaware County.

### **ELIGIBILITY**

Eligibility requirements for applicants are as follows:

- 1. Students must be a resident of Delaware County at the time of submission.
- 2. Students must have a scholastic average of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale.
- 3. Students must be entering a four-year college or university as a full-time freshman student in the fall of the year of the announcement of the scholarship award.

### APPLICATION PROCEDURE

An official application form with all supporting documents must be sent to the Chairman of the Epsilon Pi Uplift Foundation Scholarship Committee. Applications must be **received no later than May 10, 2024.** Neither the Foundation nor its Board Members will assume any responsibility for any missed deadlines or misunderstandings resulting in disqualification

The application procedure includes:

- 1. Electronic submission of the **Application Form.**
- 2. Mailed submission of an *Official Transcript* of all academic work to be sent directly from your school to the Chairman of the Scholarship Committee, enclosed in a sealed envelope from a school official.
- 3. Electronic submission of a copy of your **SAT** or **ACT** scores. (Not Mandatory)
- 4. Electronic submission of a 1000 1500 word, well organized, typewritten essay
- 5. Electronic submission of **three (3) recommendations** (forms attached):
  - i. One personal recommendation (not a family member)
  - ii. One recommendation from a teacher who has taught you an academic subject.

iii.	One recommendation from a counselor, administrator, club sponsor, job coordinator, coach, or community leader.	
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### SELECTION OF SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS AND NOTICE TO APPLICANTS

Consideration will be given to academic standing, essay, honors and awards, extracurricular activities and financial need. The students selected for awards will be notified in June.

### DISBURSEMENT OF AWARDS

The scholarships will be dispersed to the college or university under the following conditions:

- 1. The recipient submits a letter indicating admission to a four-year institution to the Chairman of the Scholarship Committee
- 2. The recipient forwards verification of acceptance and registration to the Chairman of the Scholarship Committee.
